Communications Report – Dec 2020

Public Health Site Visit

- On November 17th we had a site visit with our Public Health contact to review the parameters in place and to make recommendations as to how to continue in a safe manner.
- Meeting went very good and only 2 observations that required attention (which have been addressed).
- At the time of the visit we were in the GREEN COVID awareness stage

COVID Awareness Safety Stages

- Below is a recap of current and additional stages (if needed)
- This is a fluently moving target as information is subject to change depending on the situation which can include guidelines within the stages.
- Currently we are in YELLOW and the anticipated next step would be ORANGE however there is always a possibility that ORANGE could be bypassed and move directly to RED if the situation required.

Green to Yellow COVID Awareness Stage

- We are currently in the YELLOW stage of COVID awareness
- There was no impact to our programming requirements to move from Green to Yellow


YELLOW to ORANGE STAGE

- Last week the COVID planning group received approval from Public Health on our RTP
 alternations if we had to move to the ORANGE awareness level. We are trying to plan 1 step
 ahead of current levels to avoid a potential pause in programming if we do not have proper
 guidelines in place.
- Please refer to the attachment in the email for the guidelines on this level.
- Key takeaways from this are:
 - Each player under the age of 18 is permitted to have 1 support person in attendance.
 We have changed the wording from Spectator in the original RTP document to support person to avoid any confusion with the members.
 - If support person leaves the building they are not permitted back in and need to pick up there participant outside after the ice session is over.
 - As per Public Health siblings are NOT permitted to be in faciality during ice session.
- We are still waiting for the City of Owen Sound approval on the ORANGE awareness RTP

RED STAGE

- Once we receive approval from the City of Owen Sound on the ORANGE awareness RTP amendments we will begin the RED preparation.
- The RED awareness restrictions could put OSMHG in a position where we need to pause our programming as we would be unable to operate as we currently operate.
- We need to discuss with OMHA and Public Health to ensure the current restrictions will
 continue or if modifications are coming, however the current guidelines are as follows:
 - Maximum 10 persons on the ice pad (includes Coaches and Trainers)
 - No GAMES or SCRIMMAGES during this stage
 - o No additional persons in the facility
 - I am not sure OMSHG could operate programming given these current guidelines within the RED awareness level.

- · Instruction training for registered players within Association
- · Strict on-ice physical distance required
- · Max 10 participants (players & coaches) on-ice
- · Minimum 2 registered bench staff present
 - Recommend 1 on-ice coach
 - Recommend 1 off-ice trainer (behind glass) to allow for maximum on-ice participants

COVID TRACING

- This has gone well however an email is going to all teams in regard to the manner in which the sheets are completed and sent in.
- The past couple of weeks the sheets have become very inconsistent in relation to how they are being recorded. Templates supplied to all teams as to the format in which they are required

GENERAL REMINDER

We should all continue to remind our membership group that it is vital that everyone follows and adheres to the guidelines for our programming to continue. The guidelines are put in place for the safety of our participants and volunteers.

OSMHG – RTP – APPENDIX A – ORANGE LEVEL OPERATIONAL MODIFCATIONS

Date - XXXXXXXXXXXXXXXX

As a result of the Grey Bruce region entering the **COVID ORANGE ZONE** of awareness, OSMHG will be following the following operational guidelines as per the Provincial regulations. These protocols will be in place effective XXXXXXXXXXXXXXXXXX and will remain in place until directed by the Grey Bruce Public Health unit & the City of Owen Sound.

ORANGE ZONE GUIDELINES

- Each Participant under the age of 18 is permitted 1 support person to accompany them to the ice session. There will be no additional spectators permitted into the facility.
- The support person is permitted to stay onsite providing they are following social distancing & safety measures including face covering guidelines @ all times. If you are the support person please ensure you remain at a safe distance as identified within the ice facility.
- If the support person leaves the ice facility during the session, they are not permitted back into the facility and will need to ensure alternative arrangements for there participant to ensure proper supervision is available after the ice session.
- Participants will enter the facility as per our current guidelines within the Return to Play (must come dressed in their bottom gear).
- Participants are permitted to change into street cloths after there ice session and MUST BE OUT
 OF THE BUILDING WITHIN 15 MINUTES OF ICE SESSION ENDING.
- Showers will be permitted for WEEKDAY MORNING ice sessions and will NOT BE PERMITTED for all other ice sessions.
- While in the building face coverings are required including the changerooms.

OSMHG – RTP – APPENDIX A – ORANGE LEVEL OPERATIONAL MODIFCATIONS

A brief Overview of the guidelines in relation to minor sports within the ORANGE zone:

Sports and recreational fitness facilities – as of November 24th, 2020

- Maintain 2 metre physical distancing, unless engaged in a sport
- Maximum of 50 people total in areas with weights and exercise machines and all classes
- Maximum of 10 people per room indoors and 25 outdoors in fitness or exercise classes
- No spectators permitted (exemption for parent and guardian supervision of children)
- Team or individual sports must be modified to avoid physical contact with an exemption for high performance athletes, including parasport athletes, and professional leagues; maximum
 50 people per league
- Patrons may only be in the facility for 90 minutes except if engaging in a sport
- Limit volume of music to be low enough that a normal conversation is possible; measures to prevent shouting by both instructors and members of the public
- Face coverings required except when exercising
- Increase spacing between patrons to 3 metres in areas where there are weights or exercise equipment and in exercise and fitness classes
- Require contact information for all members of the public that enter the facility
- Require reservation for entry; one reservation for teams
- Screening of patrons is required, in accordance with instructions issued by the Office of the Chief Medical Officer of Health
- A <u>safety plan</u> is required to be prepared and made available upon request
