PRESIDENT'S REPORT 2012 - 2013

Thank you to everyone for taking the time to attend the 2012-2013 Owen Sound Minor Hockey Group (OSMHG) Annual Meeting.

This thank you also extends to those who volunteered their time as Coaches, Managers, Trainers, Convenors, and our hard working Executive Members.

OSMHG is fortunate to have two (2) major fund raising venues; the Attack 50/50 Draws and weekly Bingo's. Revenues generated from these fundraisers benefit both the House League and Rep players.

The "Ice Magic" Program was expanded last year with continued support from the "Josh Olynyck Memorial Fund" and the Annual "Sick Shot Tournament".

Even with these attempts to reduce registration costs and offering "free" registration for first-time players, OSMHG experienced a significant drop in participants for the first time in several years. This resulted in a reduction of House League teams in all age groups.

In 2013, the City of Owen Sound increased prime ice rentals by 3%, while also reducing the minor sports subsidy by 5%. Ice rental is by far our largest expense and will result in a small increase in registration costs.

Now Resident parents also have the additional costs of the fee charged to out-of-town players.

All summer sports groups are reporting a decrease in registrations and Minor Hockey is anticipating similar losses.

I encourage everyone to review and understand the non-resident policy, both the fees and the refunds. Any concerns you may have should be directed to your Elected Officials for consideration in future years.

INDEPENDENT AUDITORS' REPORT

To the Board of Directors of Owen Sound Minor Hockey Group:

Report on the Financial Statements

We have audited the accompanying financial statements of Owen Sound Minor Hockey Group, which comprise the statement of financial position as at April 30, 2012, and the statement of operations and changes in fund balances and cash flow statement for the year then ended, and a summary of significant accounting policies and other explanatory information.

Management's Responsibility for the Financial Statements

Management is responsible for the preparation and fair presentation of these financial statements in accordance with Canadian generally accepted accounting principles and for such internal control as management determines is necessary to enable the preparation of financial statements that are free from material misstatement, whether due to fraud or error.

Auditors' Responsibility

Our responsibility is to express an opinion on these financial statements based on our audit. We conducted our audit in accordance with Canadian generally accepted auditing standards. Those standards require that we comply with ethical requirements and plan and perform the audit to obtain reasonable assurance about whether the financial statements are free from material misstatement.

An audit involves performing procedures to obtain audit evidence about the amounts and disclosures in the financial statements. The procedures selected depend on the auditor's judgment, including the assessment of the risks of material misstatement of the financial statements, whether due to fraud or error. In making those risk assessments, the auditor considers internal control relevant to the Organization's preparation and fair presentation of the financial statements in order to design audit procedures that are appropriate in the circumstances, but not for the purpose of expressing an opinion on the effectiveness of the Organization's internal control. An audit also includes evaluating the appropriateness of accounting policies used and the reasonableness of accounting estimates made by management, as well as evaluating the overall presentation of the financial statements.

We believe that the audit evidence we have obtained is sufficient and appropriate to provide a basis for our qualified audit opinion.

Basis for Qualified Opinion

Owen Sound Minor Hockey Group derives revenue from donations and fundraising activities, the completeness of which is not susceptible to satisfactory audit verification. Accordingly, our verification of these revenues was limited to the amounts recorded in the records of the Organization. Consequently, we were unable to determine whether any adjustments to revenues, excess of revenue over expenditures, assets, or fund balances were necessary.

Qualified Opinion

In our opinion, except for the possible effects of the matter described in the Basis for Qualified Opinion paragraph, the financial statements present fairly, in all material respects, the financial position of Owen Sound Minor Hockey Group as at April 30, 2012, and the results of its operations and its cash flows for the year then ended in accordance with Canadian generally accepted accounting principles.

NOTES TO THE FINANCIAL STATEMENTS AS AT APRIL 30, 2012

1. PURPOSE OF THE ORGANIZATION

The Owen Sound Minor Hockey Group exists to provide children living in and around Owen Sound with the opportunity to play minor hockey.

2. SIGNIFICANT ACCOUNTING POLICIES

The Owen Sound Minor Hockey Group follows the deferral method of accounting for contributions with fund accounting.

The following is a summary of certain significant accounting policies followed in the preparation of the financial statements.

(A) FUND ACCOUNTING

Revenue and expenditures related to the general operations of the Organization are recorded in the General Fund.

Revenue and expenditures related to 50/50 draw proceeds are recorded in the 50/50 Fund. Expenditures from this fund are restricted by the Alcohol and Gaming Commission of Ontario.

Revenue and expenditures related to the operation of the Minor Hockey bingo are recorded in the Bingo Fund. Use of bingo proceeds is restricted by the Alcohol and Gaming Commission of Ontario.

(B) REVENUE RECOGNITION

The Organization's revenue consists of registration, sponsor, gate, rep try out, tournament and clinic fees, as well as fundraising.

Restricted contributions (i.e. Bingo and 50/50) are recognized as revenue of the appropriate fund in the year in which the related expenditures are incurred. Unrestricted contributions are recognized as revenue of the appropriate fund when received or receivable if the amount can be reasonably estimated and collection is reasonably assured.

(C) PROPERTY AND EQUIPMENT

The Organization is exempt from the requirement to record property and equipment since the average of its gross revenue for the current and preceding period is less than \$500,000. Property and equipment held by the Organization include miscellaneous hockey equipment and office equipment.

(D) DONATED EQUIPMENT, MATERIALS AND SERVICES

The Organization records the value of donated equipment, materials and services when a fair value can be reasonably estimated and when they are normally purchased by the Organization and would be paid for if not donated.

(E) INVESTMENTS

Investments are classified as Available for Sale and are recorded at fair market value. Quoted market price was used to estimate the fair value of investments.

(F) CONTRIBUTED SERVICES

Volunteers contribute a significant number of hours each year to assist the Organization in carrying out its services. Contributed services are not recognized in the financial statements because of the difficulty in determining the fair value.

3. INCOME TAXES

The Organization is exempt from tax under section 149 (1) (1) of the Income Tax Act.

4. LEGAL STATUS

The Organization was established as a Corporation without share capital under the Corporations Act of Ontario by letters patent dated October 9, 1973.

DUE TO/FROM FUNDS

During the year \$27,940 (net) was transferred to the General Fund from the Bingo Fund to assist with operating expenses. From the 50/50 Fund \$46,893 (net) was transferred to the General Fund to assist with operating expenses.

6. FINANCIAL INSTRUMENTS

The Organization's financial instruments consist of cash, investments, accounts receivable and accounts payable. Carrying amounts for cash, accounts receivable and accounts payable approximate fair value because of the short maturity of those instruments.

Investments are comprised of Guaranteed Investment Certificates with interest rates ranging from 1.5% to 3.3% and with maturity dates ranging from one to three years. The cost of these investments plus accrued interest approximate fair market value.

Unless otherwise noted it is management's opinion that the Organization is not exposed to significant interest, currency or credit risks arising from financial instruments.

7. FUTURE ACCOUNTING PRONOUNCEMENTS

Future of Financial Reporting

The Accounting Standards Board (AcSB) responsible for the accounting standards for private sector not-for-profit organizations has issued a proposed new set of standards for not-for-profit organizations as part of the CICA Handbook. The AcSB has concluded that Not-for-Profit organizations will be given a choice of adopting International Financial Reporting Standards (IFRS) or a new set of accounting standards for not-for profit organizations. Adoption of a new standard is not expected until the fiscal year beginning May 1, 2012. The impact of the changes on the financial statements is dependent upon the set of standards adopted and is not yet determinable.

Registrars Report

2012 - 2013

Owen Sound Minor Hockey registered 578 players for the 2012 hockey season. There were 46 teams in all.

A large percentage of parents are using the on-line registration and paying by credit card. I would like to encourage more to use this method of registering rather than manual as it helps to reduce the work at my end in handling paper forms and getting cheques to the treasurer for deposit.

Thank you to all the managers and convenors for their work in supplying information that is required when submitting the rosters for approval. The House League seems to always need more volunteers who are willing to take the coach and trainer certifications. Thank you to all who have stepped up and taken the time to do this.

Please pass the word on to other parents, who have children and may be thinking of enrolling them in to hockey, that registration is on-going through-out the summer. Our website provides the information needed for them to get their son or daughter registered.

Hopefully the snow is now gone for good. Have a great summer (hopefully we will get some warm weather). See you in the fall.
